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#### PREFACE

The Federal-State Market News Office in Onley, Virginia, issued daily vegetable bulletins, with potatoes featured, from June 20 through August 12, 1969. This service was conducted cooperatively by the United States Department of Agriculture, Consumer and Marketing Service; Virginia Department of Agriculture & Commerce, Division of Markets; and Maryland Extension Service, Department of Markets.

Information on acreage and production was taken from reports of the Crop Reporting Board of the United States Department of Agriculture, Statistical Reporting Service, Washington, D. C.

Truck shipment information was primarily supplied by the Federal-State Inspection Service of Virginia and of Maryland. However, in instances where inspection service was absent, truck shipment information was obtained directly from shippers. Also, an estimated allowance was made for those shipments which were not reported through any source.

Information on rail shipments was supplied by the originating railroads to the Washington Office. Total movement by states was tabulated and wired to all Market News Offices for publication. Local rail reports and destinations were supplied by the Pennsylvania Railroad through their agents on the Eastern Shore of Virginia.

Since the season had not ended when the office closed, the statistics shown in this summary are not complete and some are subject to revision.

We wish to express our appreciation for the cooperation and consideration extended us during the season by members of the Trade. We also thank the members of other agencies who furnished information used in the daily reports and in this summary.

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#### Review of the 1969 Virginia Potato Season

#### Harvest Summary

The 1969 white potato harvest began in volume on the Eastern Shore of Virginia during the week of June 16, although some minor digging had occurred earlier. The harvest peaked on July 14 when truck shipments totaled 304; however, beginning with July 5 truck shipments exceeded 180 per day for fourteen out of fifteen days.

Maryland began moving potatoes after the first of July and continued into September.

F.O.B. Shipping Point Prices, if plotted on a graph, would give the appearance of an inverted horseshoe. The f.o.b. price on June 20 was \$3.25, but by June 26 had fallen to \$2.75. The price remained at \$2.75 until July 9, although a weakness in the market had become apparent as early as July 7. By July 16 the price had dropped to \$2.00. During the fifteen days of greatest production, the f.o.b. price ranged from \$2.75 to \$2.00. This period accounted for 55% of the total movement.

Heavy rainfall began in the Delaware and New Jersey potato areas on July 19, and the market strengthened for Eastern Shore potatoes. On July 28 sales were being made at \$3.00, and by August 4 were reported at \$4.00. However, rain had also occurred in Virginia and movement at the higher price level was sharply curtailed.

Widespread frustration was expressed by most farmers over the rapid fall in prices during June and July. Many sales, especially in Northampton County, were made at less than the quoted f.o.b. price - due in large part to poor quality. Concern was also voiced over the fact that the price fell by 25-cent increments instead of by five- or ten-cent increments.

#### Acreage

Acreage on the Eastern Shore of Virginia for 1969 was indicated in July at 29,000 acres according to the Statistical Reporting Service, U. S. Department of Agriculture. This represented an increase of 1,400 acres over 1968, and 2,200 over 1967. In the Norfolk area, acreage continued to decline as it had during recent years. Acreage in this area was indicated in July at 2,300 acres as compared with 2,500 in 1968.

#### Weather

Planting of potatoes was begun on the Eastern Shore of Virginia about the middle of February. However, due to heavy rains and several snowfalls, plowing and planting were curtailed for three weeks or more in some areas. Due to these weather conditions, the bulk of the crop in both counties was not planted until between the fifteenth of March and the fifth of April.

Rainfall was generally scarce during the growing season thus causing many farmers to produce yields which were lower than normal. However, relatively heavy rainfall in Northampton County during the early part of the harvest contributed to a serious quality problem later in the season. Also, heavy rains during the latter part of the harvest slowed digging in some sections of Accomack County.

## Varieties

The principal variety of potato planted was the Pungo, as it had been during the eight previous years. The Pungo represented 53% of all seed imported, a 2% increase over the previous year. Superiors and Katahdins both represented 18% of seed imports. The La Chipper, although representing only 4% of total seed imported, was the fourth most popular variety and its usage was up substantially from the previous year.

#### Labor

Although the supply of labor appeared adequate to handle the harvest, the quality of the force continued to deteriorate. Many farmers in both counties experienced high absenteeism, and work as a whole was of poor quality.

The usage of mechanical harvesters increased again this year, following the trend of recent years.

#### Containers

Consumer packs continued to be the principal type of package demanded by the Trade. Unwashed 50's and 100's proved to be difficult to move, as they had been during the previous year. The percentage of potatoes moved in bulk to processors showed gains during this harvest, as in the 1968 harvest.

#### Shipments and Transportation

Truck shipments continued to show increases over rail movement. Our truck shipments totaled 5,912 for the year - down seventeen percent from the previous year. Rail shipments totaled only 67, a decrease of fortyfour percent from 1968. Primarily, the destination of all rail movement was to Canadian markets.

Truck shortages did not present as great a problem to shippers during 1969 as they did in 1968. Prior to the harvesting season, truck rates from the area were adjusted upward approximately ten percent, contributing in part for the increase in available trucks.

Several times during the early weeks of the harvest, shippers reported that they were unable to get rail cars moved after loading. This resulted in late arrivals and damage to potatoes.

#### Markets

New York, Philadelphia, and Baltimore were the principal markets used by Virginia shippers again in 1969. However, the percentage of total movement to these three markets was less than that of 1968. Also, Philadelphia replaced New York as the leading consumer of Virginia potatoes. Washington and Cleveland showed more actual unloads than in the previous year; whereas, Pittsburgh, Boston, Detroit, Chicago, Atlanta, and Birmingham showed fewer unloads.

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#### SHIPPING POINT PRICES

(Sales F.O.B. Shipping Point Basis, 100-Pound Sacks, U. S. No. 1, Size A)

For washed and unwashed potatoes in the Eastern Shore Area, 50-pound sacks usually sell at  $20\phi$  per hundredweight above the 100-pound sacks; 20pound sacks usually sell at  $70-75\phi$  per hundredweight above the 100-pound sacks; 10-pound sacks usually sell at \$1.00 per hundredweight above the 100-pound sacks. Markups are not available from other areas.

Eastern Shore farmers customarily receive 25¢ less than the f.o.b. price.
