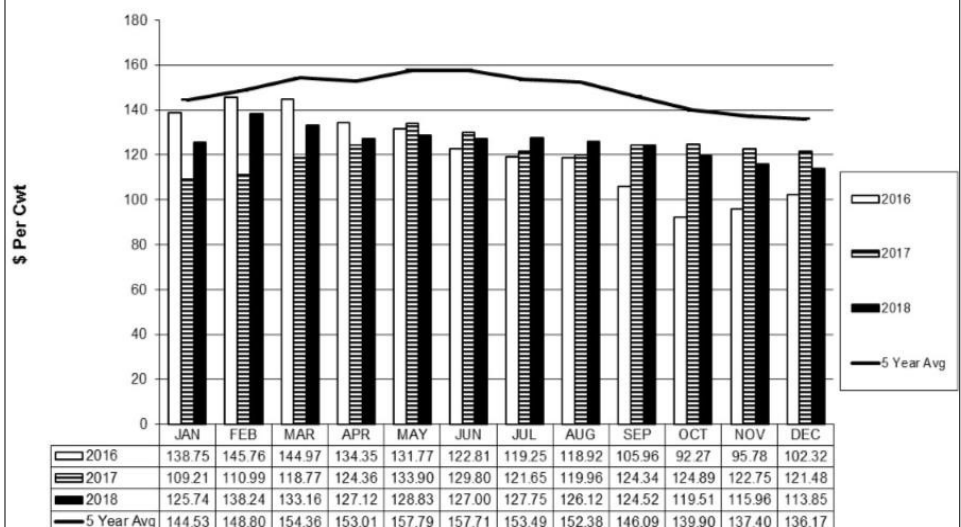

Soybeans, Wheat Up Compared to 2017**

Corn stored in all last year.

positions on December 1, 2018 totaled 12 billion bushels, down 5 percent from December 1, 2017. Of the total stocks, 7.45 billion bushels are stored on farms, down 4 percent from a year earlier. Off-farm stocks, at 4.50 billion bushels, are down 7 percent from a year ago. The September-November 2018 indicated disappearance is 4.61 billion bushels, compared with 4.34 billion bushels during the same period

all positions on December 1, 2018 totaled 3.74 billion bushels, up 18 percent from December 1, 2017. Soybean stocks stored on farms totaled 1.94 billion bushels, up 30 percent from a year ago. Off-farm stocks, at 1.80 billion bushels, are up 7 percent from last December. Indicated disappearance for September-November 2018 totaled 12.5 billion bushels, down 20 percent from the same

period a year earlier.

Soybeans stored in all positions on December 1, 2018 totaled 2 billion bushels, up 7 percent from a year ago. On-farm stocks are estimated at 504 million bushels, up 28 percent from last December. Off-farm stocks, at 1.50 billion bushels, are up 1 percent from a year ago. The September-November 2018 indicated disappearance is 390 million bushels, 1 percent below the same period a year earlier.
