1. Average annual value of produce sold during the previous 3-year period is <\$25,000.

2. Produce grown is for personal consumption or on-farm consumption.

3. The only produce that is grown on your farm is on this list:

Asparagus; beans, black; beans, great Northern; beans, kidney; beans, lima; beans, navy; beans, pinto; beets, garden (roots and tops); beets, sugar; cashews; cherries, sour; chickpeas; cocoa beans; coffee beans; collards; corn, sweet; cranberries; dates; dill (seeds and weed); eggplants; figs; ginger; hazelnuts; horseradish; lentils; okra; peanuts; pecans; peppermint; potatoes; pumpkins; squash, winter; sweet potatoes; and water chestnuts.

4. Produce grown is *not* considered a Raw Agricultural Commodity.

Produce that is *not* a Raw Agricultural Commodity, means the produce receives commercial processing that adequately reduces the presence of microorganisms of public health significance.

5. During the previous 3-year period, the average annual value of the food the farm sold directly to qualified end-users, was more than the average annual value of the food the farm sold to all other buyers during that period; **and** The average annual value of all food the farm sold during the 3- year period was <\$500,000.

Qualified end-user means: The consumer of the food (consumer does not include a business); **or** A restaurant or retail food establishment that is located: In the same State or the same Indian reservation as the farm that produced the food; **or** Not more than 275 miles from such farm.

If you answered '**No**' to any of the questions above,
your produce farm falls under the Produce Safety Rule.

If you answered '**Yes**' to any of the questions above,
your farm may be exempt from parts of the Produce Safety Rule, with applicable documentation.
